Program Description

The Waldorf University *ELE – Fire/Rescue/EMS* program provides executive leadership education for chief fire officers, future chief fire officers and administrative personnel to enhance their leadership ability, knowledge and skills to address current and emerging trends and challenges. These trends and challenges include day-to-day, non-emergency and emergency incident related matters. The program will emphasize networking and **strong** participation in discussion and group activities.

Part of the mission of Waldorf University is to “educate the whole person emphasizing integrity and equipping students to succeed and to serve the communities where they live and work”. **Lectures, discussion, activities, and assignments will focus on specific trends, issues, and challenges among each community represented in the class.**

This program references National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standards from Fire Officer 1021 III & IV, and objectives from Waldorf University B.S in Fire Science Administration degree program. The program also advocates the National Fire Academy’s Executive Fire Officer Program (EFOP).

Participants who complete the program will be eligible to receive 1 elective credit hour toward a Waldorf University B.S. in Fire Science Administration.
